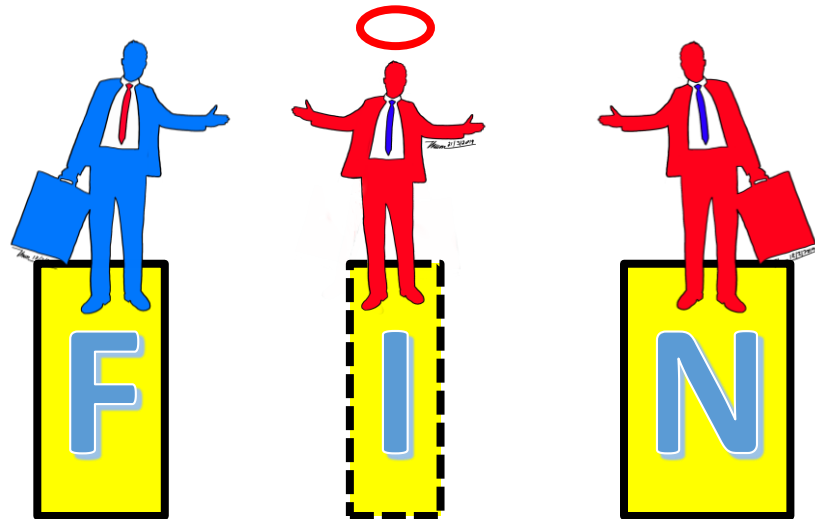
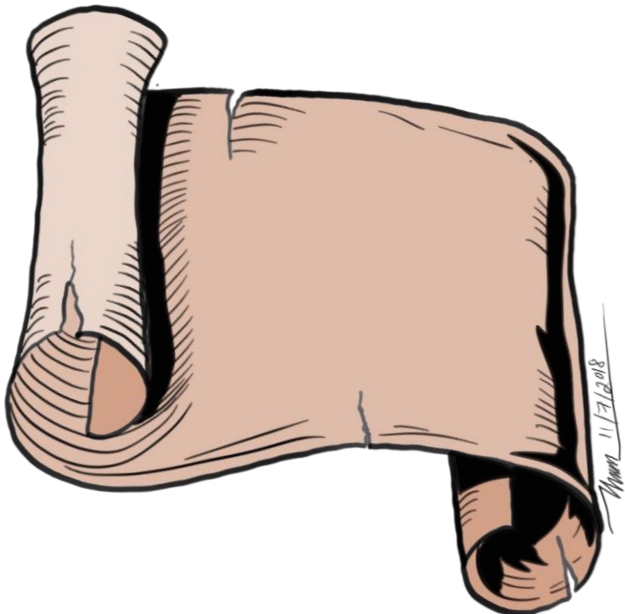

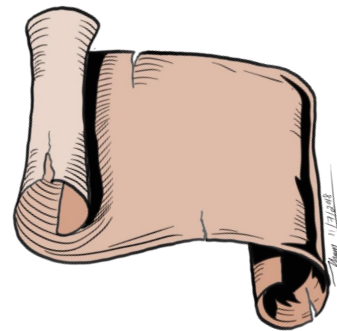
- a) **FRAUDULENT** misrepresentation

B. **ONE** of the **3** major **TYPES** of **MISREPRESENTATION**:

a) **FRAUDULENT** misrepresentation

x **FALSE STATEMENT** made **KNOWINGLY**

x **NOT BELIEVING** in its **TRUTH**

x **RECKLESS** whether **TRUE** or **NOT**

APPLY LAW to **FACTS**

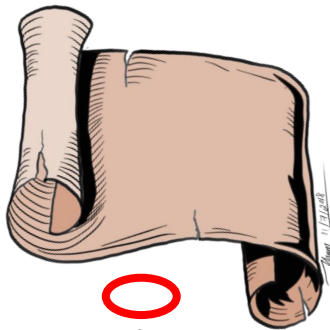

B. **ONE** of the **3** major **TYPES** of **MISREPRESENTATION**:

- b) **INNOCENT** misrepresentation
- × **STATEMENT** made **WITHOUT FRAUD**
 - × **WITHOUT FAULT** on the part of the maker
 - × **REASONABLE GROUNDS** to **BELIEVE** it to be **TRUE**.

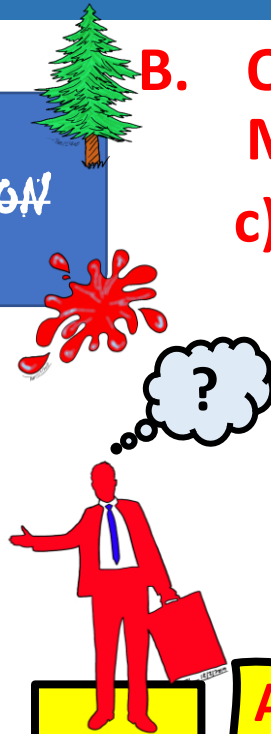
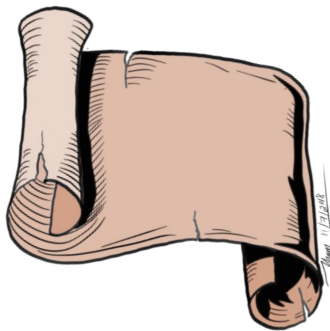
APPLY LAW to FACTS

(A)(1) The seller made the **STATEMENT** with **reasonable grounds to believe** (... the latest product information supplied by the manufacturer) to be **TRUE**.

B. **ONE** of the **3** major **TYPES** of **MISREPRESENTATION**:

- c) **NEGLIGENT** misrepresentation
- × **STATEMENT** made without **DUE CARE**
 - × **NO FRAUDULENT INTENTION**
 - × **NO REASONABLE GROUNDS** to **BELIEVE** it to be **TRUE**
