

TERMS OF CONTRACT

- × UNREASONABLE & NOT BENEFICIAL i.e. 7 year apprenticeship agreement, not to marry, poor pay, etc.
- × THEREFORE UNENFORCEABLE

(D) RATIFIABLE CONTACT

DANY OTHER TYPE OF

CONTRACTS i.e.

- × (A) Contracts for "necessaries"
- ×(B) Beneficial contracts
- ×(C) Voidable contracts
